# Aims and Scope

The Arab Journal of Water is a scientific refereed Journal published twice a year by the Arab Water Council. The mission of the Journal is to contribute in solving Arab and Regional water issues by publishing scientific papers in the areas of integrated water resources management, water policies, trans-boundary water issues, water conflict and diplomacy. In addition, the Journal addresses traditional water issues in different sectors, namely; urban, industrial, agricultural and transportation. The specific objectives of the Journal are:

- 1. Provide a forum for debate and create a dialogue among water researchers and professionals to exchange knowledge and experience.
- 2. Enhance conducting research in integrated water resources management and comprehensive policy.
- 3. Contribute to the advancement of scientific research in water management within the context of sustainable development.

The Journal will published research papers, review articles, technical notes, case studies and progress reports in all management and policy aspect of water resources in the following areas.:

- 1. Integrated Water Resources Management.
- 2. Planning the use of natural resources.
- 3. Management of unconventional water resources.
- 4. Technical, economic and management aspects of water desalination.
- 5. National policies in water resources management and development.
- 6. Management and economical analysis of large water resources projects.
- 7. Institutional and legislative water resources policies.
- 8. The effect of climate changes on water resources and their uses.
- 9. The use of modern and robust research tools in water management.
- 10. Crises management in cases of drought and floods.
- 11. Trans-boundary water issues and conflict resolution.
- 12. Polices toward sustainable eco-system and restoration management and mechanisms.
- 13. Successful and unique case studies and lesson learned in IWRM.

The published articles reflect the opinions of the authors and do not necessary reflect the opinions of the editorial board, the policy of the Journal or the policy of the Arab Water Council.

#### **Instruction to Authors**

The Arab Journal of Water publishes research papers that exhibit originality and scientific approach. Papers in Arabic language are encouraged but papers in English can be accepted if they address the water problems of the Arab countries and the region. Original research papers, synthesis papers, review papers, discussions, or technical notes are accepted for publication. Following are the general instructions for the process of publication:

- 1. The manuscript must be typewritten, double spaced with a maximum of 30 pages. It should be submitted in three hard copies and a soft copy on a floppy disc or CD, or it can send via email. The author's names (first, middle and last) must be written with their full postal addresses, positions and emails while the corresponding author must be identified including the phone and fax numbers. The system of international units should be used. Scientific abbreviations may be used provided that they have been explained when first appeared in the text.
- 2. Authors should submit with their research two abstracts; one in the language of the article and it should be typed at the beginning after the title and before the introduction followed by the keywords before the introduction. As for the other abstract, it should be typed at the end of the paper on a separate sheet. Each abstract should not contain more than 250 words.
- 3. The authors should submit a written consent that they will not publish the paper in any other journal at the same time of its publication in the Arab Journal of Water.
- 4. Figures and tables should be numbered consecutively according to their occurrence in the article with headings. When mentioned in the text, the same consecutive should be used..
- 5. For documentation and references, the authors should observe the following points:
  - a. The reference is indicated in the text by the author's name and year of publication between two brackets, example (Vlachos, 2002) or (Shatanawi, 2005).
  - b. In the event that an author or reference is quoted or mentioned at the beginning of a paragraph or a sentence or an author who has an innovative idea, the author's name is written followed by the year between two brackets; example Abu Zeid (1998).
  - c. If the number of authors exceeds two, the name of the first author *et al.* is written in the text (Allam *et al.*, 2001). Full names are written in the references section regardless of their number.
  - d. All publication cited in the text should be presented in the list of reference following the text of the manuscript.
  - e. Footnotes may be used to solve any ambiguity or explain something such as a term that require illustration. In this case, the term is given a number and the explanation is written in a footnote at the bottom of the page.
- 6. The editorial board shall be responsible for informing the authors of any measure concerning their research such as receiving, accepting or rejection.
- 7. The manuscript will be sent to a minimum of two independent reviewers but may be sent back to the authors for revision. Submission of the revised manuscript should be made within one month.

- 8. The papers accepted for publication shall be published according to the final date of acceptance.
- 9. Upon acceptance of a paper, authors do not have the right to translate, quote, cite, summarize or use the research in any other media. Authors are responsible for obtaining from the copyright holder permission to reproduce any material for which copyright exists.
- 10. The authors will be sent one copy of the issue in which the work appears, in addition to 25 off-prints that will be mailed to the corresponding author..
- 11. The editorial board reserves the right regarding the rejection of any research for publication without any justification.
